SERMON DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- 1. Why were the crowds so upset that Jesus would associate with someone like Zacchaeus (cf. v. 7)? What do we learn about Jesus from his willingness to associate with someone like Zacchaeus?
- 2. In v. 10 we are reminded that the Son of Man came to seek and to save the lost. What implications does this have for us in terms of the way we think about Jesus and in terms of the way we think about lost people living around us?
- 3. In both Luke 18 (the story of the rich ruler) and in Luke 19 (the story of Zacchaeus), we find the story of someone who is rich. How are these stories similar and how are they different? What can we learn by comparing and contrasting the two stories?
- 4. Why is Christianity a religion of great joy (cf. v. 6)? How can we cultivate more joy in our lives in the midst of the brokenness of this world?
- 5. How does seeing Jesus as the great treasure lead to being generous toward others (cf. v. 8a)? If we lack generosity, what might this say about our view of God and our view of treasure?
- 6. In what ways do you think God might be calling you to use your resources in order to be a blessing to others?
- 7. What is repentance and why is it a necessary part of the Christian life?
- 8. Are there specific areas God is calling you to repent? If so, what are those areas and what would repentance look like?
