SERMON DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- 1. As you read the familiar resurrection story in Luke 24:1-12, what is it that sticks out to you the most?
- 2. The disciples were clearly not expecting the tomb to be empty on Sunday morning. Why is that detail important and how does it impact the way we think about the credibility of the resurrection story?
- 3. As you think about the resurrection of Jesus Christ, what evidence would you point to as proof that Jesus actually rose from the dead?
- 4. Why is it important to note that Jesus had predicted his death and resurrection (cf. v. 7)?
- 5. Are there any promises of God that you have a hard time believing? How does v. 7 give you confidence that you can believe those promises?
- 6. How does the resurrection of Jesus change the way we think about the trials and difficulties and troubles of this world?
- 7. What is one practical step you would like to take this week to live differently in light of what you read here in Luke 24?
