SERMON DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. If you were to summarize the message of Amos 3, how would you summarize?
2. In what way were the Israelites more accountable to God than the other nations (cf. Amos 3:2)? And what implications might their heightened accountability have for us as non-Israelites living in a completely different era?
3. As hinted at by the reference to the altars of Bethel in v. 14, the Israelites were not worshiping God in the way that he had prescribed. Why was this a big deal and why is it still a big deal even today to make sure that we worship God in the way that he has prescribed?
4. As you think about other churches or even other religions in our culture, in what ways do you see other churches or other religions failing to worship God in the way that he has prescribed?
5. As you evaluate your own life, are there any aspects of God's character (as revealed in Scripture) that you have a tough time accepting? If so, what does that reveal about your heart?
6. Given what we read in vv. 9-10 and in v. 15 it's obvious that the people of Israel were living lives of self-indulgence rather than caring for and loving others. Why is that a problem and do you see any evidences of that type of living in your own life?
7. Are there any areas of your life you are presuming on God's kindness and not living in light of the information that has been revealed to you through God's Word? If so, what would repentance look like in that area?
8. As you think about Amos 3, what are the biggest lessons you might take away? And how might you apply those lessons to your life this week?
