SERMON DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- 1. In Amos 5:18-27, the people of Israel were looking forward to the day of the Lord when in reality they should have been terrified of the coming day of the Lord (cf. vv. 18-20). How does this serve as a warning for us and what other passages of Scripture can you think of that warn against the danger of self-deception?
- 2. The people of Israel clearly did not seem to see themselves clearly. What are some tools that God has given us to help see ourselves clearly? Are you utilizing those tools in your life currently? If so, what does that look like?
- 3. Do you have people in your life who are willing to lovingly point out sin in your own life? If so, who are those people and how do they go about lovingly pointing out your sin?
- 4. Are you willing to listen when others point out your sin? Or are you more likely to be defensive and dismissive?
- 5. How can we grow in humility so that we are more willing to receive the correction of others?
- 6. In what ways were the Israelites in Amos 5 not seeing God clearly?
- 7. How do we guard against making God into our own image (i.e. how do we guard against imagining God as we want him to be rather than seeing him for who he actually is)?
- 8. Are there any attributes of God emphasized in Scripture that you have a hard time accepting? How do you think you could get to a place of acceptance?
