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SERMON QUESTIONS

1. What might be some wrongs way to look at the promise of Romans 8:28? What would be some dangers in looking at the promise in those wrong ways?

2. Why is it important for us to remember that Romans 8:28 appears in the context of a passage that has been talking openly about the reality of suffering in this world (cf. Romans 8:17-25)?

3. In light of vv. 29-30, what is the good that God is working toward in the lives of believers?

4. Given the content of vv. 29-30, the promise of Romans 8:28 is clearly pointing us toward eternity. How does this change the way we think about our current suffering and the work God is doing in us?

5. Vv. 29-30 repeatedly emphasize God's initiating work in our lives. Why is it good news that God is doing the work in us to make us into what we need to be?

6. What is the significance of the last phrase in v. 30 (he also glorified) being in the past tense? What does this tell us about the certainty of God's work and promises?

7. While taking into account its actual context, why is the promise of Romans 8:28 incredibly precious? How does this verse encourage you in the midst of life's difficulties?

8. As you think about the entirety of your life (both the ups and downs), how have you seen God use all circumstances for your good?

9. How should Romans 8:28-30 change the way we view future trials and troubles that might come our way?
